# Announcement

This scholarship is intended to assist students through the educational journey to becoming a licensed funeral director and embalmer. The Scholarship Committee will award up to \$10,000, with a maximum amount awarded of \$2,000 per recipient. Students who apply and do not receive the award may apply again. However, students who do receive the award may not reapply.

The Kathryn Cantillon-White Memorial Scholarship will be available for students during the 2022 Winter Term. Applicants must be enrolled as a student at FINE Mortuary College and must complete the term in which the scholarship is awarded.

The Kathryn Cantillon-White Memorial Scholarship may be paid directly to the student account at FINE Mortuary College, or if your account has a zero balance it may be paid directly to the student.

The deadline to apply for this scholarship is November 25, 2022.
